Combined forces of two assessors, Mr. Armando D. Bolivar and Mr. Jonathan C. Lanterna, will evaluate the candidates in the 6 core competencies which include minor maintenance and servicing, pre and post operation, obeying and observing traffic rules and regulations, observing road health and safety practices, implementing and coordinating accident-emergency procedures and driving the said articulated vehicle.

Candidate have also read, understood and filled out the consent form in compliance to the Data Privacy Act of 2012 considering that the activity is video recorded.

Designated TESDA representative is Mr. Clark Von C. Capul, who will provide monitoring to ensure that the assessment is according to the prescribed proceedings.

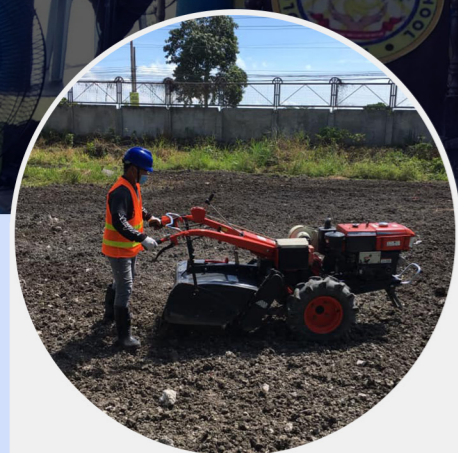
As shown in the photo album, the candidates and the other involved people are practicing the required safety and health procedures such as wearing of masks, constant use of alcohol and social distancing.

TESDA Regional Training Center – Korea Philippines Vocational Training Center (RTC-KPVTC) Davao headed by Engr. Constantino B. Panes, Jr. through the Diploma in Hotel and Restaurant Technology (DHRT) partners with the Davao City Police Office (DCPO) in their “Revitalized Pulis sa Barangay Program” today, March 18, 2021, at Purok 2, Colosas Proper, Barangay Colosas, Paquibato District, Davao City. RTC-KorPhil’s Tourism Department led by Ms. Marilou F. Coloma echoes the campaign slogan of TESDA Abot Lahat and the agency’s thrust of providing free skills training to those who have the least access to government services especially the indigenous and underprivileged sector through the facilitation of TESDA Livelihood Community-Based Training to the people in Paquibato District.

The skills trainings for this initiative include Preparing Hot Meals leading to Cookery NC II; Process Food by Salting, Curing and Smoking leading to Food Processing NC II; and Bread and Pastry Production NC II which will be facilitated by the tourism department pool of trainers; namely, Ms. Juvilyn T. Mahilum, Mr. Ryan B. Jandug, Ms. Emea A. Junio, and Mr. Mikko D. Rosell. Partners who graced the event are Hon. Antonio Belleria, Brgy. Captain of Brgy, Colosas; PLT Kim Vianney C. Pomperada, R-PSB Colosas Team Leader; Ms. Amie Fel. Cardente, President of Barangay Colosas Womens Association; and Ms. Jackilou Eloeterio. Moreover, inclusive on this event is the distribution of training kits which is comprised of t-shirts, aprons, towels, hairnets, face masks, and face shields. As part of TESDA’s mandate, this training signifies the government’s sincere efforts of giving free TESDA-assisted skills training to the remote and unprioritized communities in the Philippines. ONGOING: Another group of 10 candidates are currently demonstrating today, March 19, their knowledge, skills and attitude at the second day of the National Assessment in Rice Machinery Operations NC II in RTC Kor-Phil, Buhisan, Tibungco, Davao City.

The candidates will hurdle 6 core competencies and must successfully pass at least 3 competencies under the evaluation of the assessor Engr. Ernesto S. Nadera. Competencies include operation of rice machineries used in land preparation, crop establishment, crop care, harvesting and threshing, milling and drying. TESDA representative is Ms. Sandy Abutanmo who will oversee the assessment assuring that it is aligned to the standard procedure of the agency.

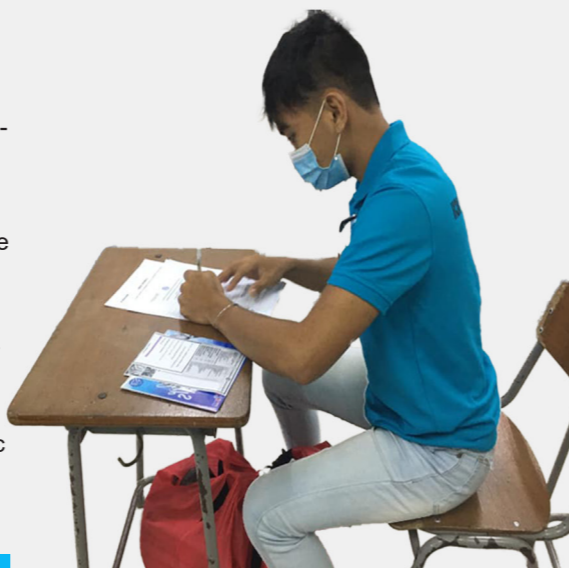


DAY 3 of 3: With the orientation started at exactly 8:00 this morning, the third day of the assessment in Rice Machinery Operations NC II gathered the five remaining candidates out of 25 to be evaluated by the assessor Engr. Ernesto S. Nadera.

Same with the candidates in the first two days, candidates today are to pass at least 3 of 6 core competencies of the qualification, completely showing competence in terms of KASH- Knowledge, Attitude, Skills and Habits.

Evidences to be collected by the assessor include performances of the candidates in the practical demonstration and one-on-one interview. In the orientation, the candidates we also made to accomplish a consent form pursuant to RA 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012 since the assessment is captured by a CCTV which records the candidates’ identity, actions and whereabouts. TESDA representative is Engr. Jeric F. Bilita who will closely monitor to ensure the integrity of the assessment process.

LOOK: Ten employed forklift truck operators are being assessed today, March 19, in a chance to get level II National Certificates in Heavy Equipment Operation (Forklift). The candidates will be tested in the written examination, skills demonstration and one-on-one interview with the assessor Engr. Arnel Y. Ansaldo. To pass the qualification, candidates will show enough competence in performing pre and post operation, basic preventive maintenance servicing and productive operation of forklift truck. TESDA representative is Engr. Jeric F. Bilita who observes the entire conduct of the assessment, evaluating if the activity is carried according to the standard procedure.



Securing Data by Creating Files Back-up over Cloud Storage

Responding to the call of TESDA Central Office that all TESDA Offices and TESDA

Technology Institutions (TTIs) should make their data secured, the Diploma of

Information Technology (DIT) conducted seminars about the ways on how to secure data and one of those is to back-up data over the Cloud.

On January 12, 2021, at the Mini-Theater of RTC-KorPhil Davao, the DIT department conducted a seminar on how to secure data by creating files back-up over cloud storage facilitated by Mr. Raye Adrian Dayot, the ICT equipment management focal of the Center. All offices of the Center sent their participants likewise non-IT trainers attended on said IT seminar. Participants were required to have return-demo on how to back-up data over the cloud after the lecture and demonstration from the resource person.

The seminar culminated with the distribution of Certificates of Participation.

This seminar will help the offices of RTC-KorPhil secure their data and securely made data available to the right persons 24/7. On the other hand, non-IT trainers now can back-up over the cloud their valuable data.

Residents of Brgy. Cabantian, Davao City get training on Organic Agriculture Production NC II



Twenty-five residents of Deca Homes in Brgy. Cabantian, Davao City are hoped to improve their backyard gardening practices as RTC-Kor-Phil Davao mobilized a skills training on Organic Agriculture Production NC II starting January 11 to March 01, 2021. A Training Induction Program (TIP), launched on January 07, was attended by the trainees to orient them about the Training for Work Scholarship Program (TWSP) and its benefits, their roles as scholars, training arrangement, among other announcements. For their 29-day training, the trainees are set to master the required skills, knowledge and attitude in producing organic chicken, vegetables, concoctions and extracts, and fertilizer.



They are also trained on how to raise organic hogs and small ruminants (goat). The training is delivered under the Flexible Learning Delivery (FLD)-consisting of face-to-face sessions for the practical demonstration of the competencies and online classes to reinforce learning about the principles of farming. The training which happened in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic made both the trainer and trainees to tighten the precautions by observing the recommended health and safety protocols such as physical distancing, wearing of mask, use of alcohol, and the likes. National assessment is scheduled on the second week of March 2021 at the Wangan National Agricultural School (WNAS) in Calinan, Davao City

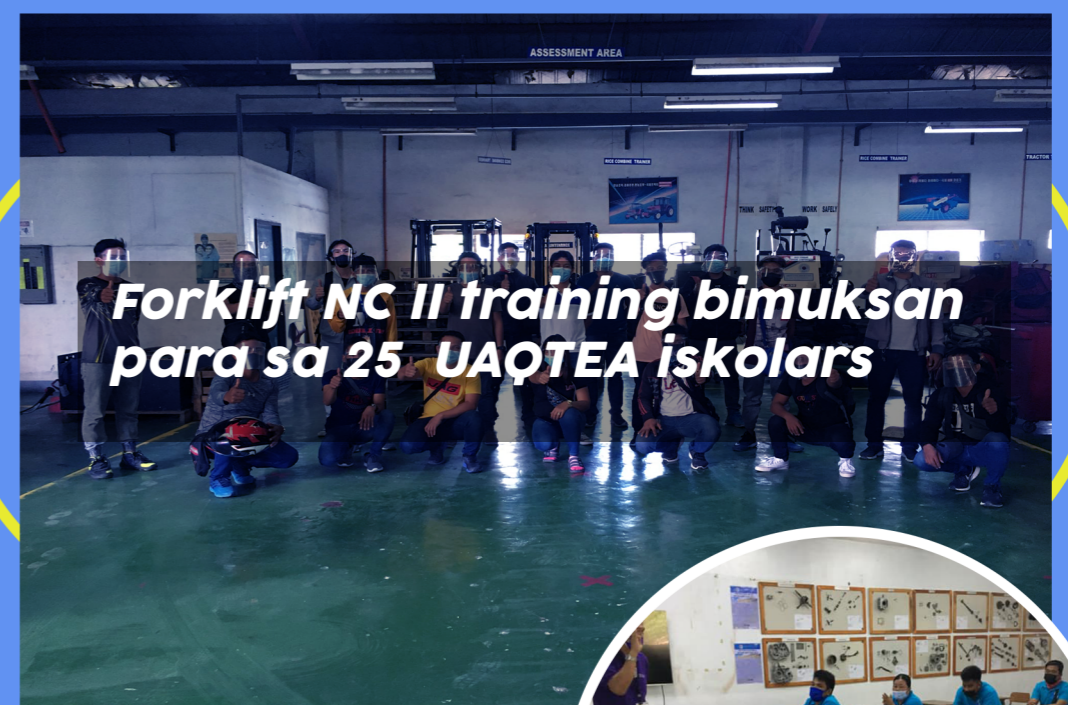
Significant Outcome/Result of the Event

“RTC - KorPhil Davao Launches Its Livelihood Enhancement and Entrepreneurship Program for the Lumon Community in Davao Oriental”

The Regional Training Center- Korea Philippines Vocational Training Center (RTC-KPVTC) Davao headed by Engr. Constantino B. Panes, Jr. together with the 701st Infantry “Kagitingan” Brigade led by its Brigade Commander, Colonel Krishnamurti A. Mortela, the Lumon Community of Davao Oriental represented by their president, Mr. Rod John D. Pandili, and supported by the Maritime Institute of Davao Oriental led by its administrator, Ms. Lydia Berzabal launches the very first Livelihood Enhancement and Entrepreneurship Program under the Herbal Processing-NTR led by researchers/trainers, Ms. Adiosa C. Embat, Ms. Mary Grace A. Pelayo, and Ms. Lanemie C. Pasaol to the Lumon Community on January 14-17, 2021 at the Maritime Institute of Davao Oriental, Inc (MIDO). This is with the training title, “Organic Medicinal Processing of Coconut and Mushroom leading to Herbal Processing (Albularyo)-NTR”. This activity is the second phase of the four-day Youth Livelihood Camp of the 701st Infantry Brigade and the Lumon Community last December 26-29, 2020 wherein they were taught to make liquid hand soaps, treatment soaps, citronella candles, and herbal oils and ointments for the future endeavors and outreach activities of the community. For the second phase, learners were taught to process and enhance their coconut and mushroom products and were introduced with other household solution products. As such, the training outputs include virgin coconut oil making, coconut water vinegar, organic bocarillo, trail mix, mushroom food seasoning, and additional household solution products such as powder detergent making and dishwashing liquid making. Moreover, a corresponding TESDA Information Drive for the promotion of TESDA Diploma Programs and Short-Term Program Offerings was conducted and facilitated by the Sr. TESD Specialist of RTC-Korphil, Mr. Jestony Mark P. Aprong and supported by the TESDA Davao Oriental Provincial Director, Ms. Leah D. Braga. This program reflects TESDA Director General Isidro S. Lapeña’s desire to invest in Wellness and Livelihood Programs in this time of pandemic and in support of the implementation of Executive Order No. 70. Moreover, this is also a testament of TESDA’s goal of providing basic services and social development packages for inclusive and sustainable peace in the country especially for the youth and for the geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas and groups.

“TVET in Poverty Reduction, Employment, Livelihood and Peacebuilding”

The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) XI Regional Training Center Korea Philippines Vocational Training Center (RTC KPVTC)- Davao headed by Engr. Constantino B. Mr. Jestony Mark Aprong, RTC KPVTC’s Sr. TESD Specialist conducted an orientation and marketing of TESDA Scholarship Programs and later gave lecture about Poverty Reduction, Livelihood, Employment and the Importance of Peacebuilding. The participants were very attentive during the lecture because they were interested to avail the TESDA Scholarship Programs. They also appreciated the discussion about poverty, development and the role of PRLEC especially by TESDA in attaining the sustainable development goal and the Ambisyon Natin 2040 which is impossible if there is war and any form of conflict in some areas. There was a question and answer at the end of orientation and lecture to answer queries and to give advice and direction to clients on their concern about TESDA.



TESDA KorPhil joins 1st Peoples Organization Summit

To further enlighten about the programs of the government as a counter mechanism to fully remove the ideology instilled by the Communist Terrorist Group, the Philippine Army (PA) 27th Infantry (Action) Battalion gathered 34 Peoples Organization presidents and representatives and other government agency collaborators to champion the 1st Peoples Organization Summit yesterday, 11 February 2021.

Conducted in the Headquarters of the 27th IB, 10th Infantry (Agila) Division, PA in Brgy. Dalisay, Panabo City, the maiden summit rallied a progressive talk enjoining PO leaders of Paquibato District particularly in the barangays of Lumiad, Malabog, Paquibato Proper, Mapula, Pañalum, Paradise Embak, Salapawan, Colosas, Tapak and Pandaitan.

The POs, which are pioneering farmers’ associations currently raising crops and animals, have lobbied their issues and felt needs such as lack of animal feeds, poor farm-to-market earth road and transport vehicle, meager supply of fingerlings (tilapia and hito), insufficient supply of seed and seedlings, lack of farm tools, limited post-harvest and processing machineries, among other concerns.

The POs expressed hopes that they will be assisted through the banner programs and services of the various government agencies present in the summit namely, the TESDA KorPhil and TESDA WNAS, BFAR XI, DOLE XI, DA XI, DTI XI, Davao CSWDO and the Davao City Agriculture Office.

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Said agencies have individually presented their mandates and services that could be availed by the POs instrumental to further increase their productivity in the farm, hence adding more livelihood and increase income for the members. For TESDA, RTC KorPhil Davao Administrator Engr. Constantino B. Panes Jr. EdD and agriculture trainer Engr. Ailyn B. Rodriguez presented the free technical-vocational trainings of the center which could help improve their farms such as Organic Agriculture Production NC II, Agricultural Crop Production NC I, Photovoltaic System Installation NC II and the likes.

During the open forum, Engr. Panes articulated approval on the request of Brgy. Salapawan for a TESDA training in Driving NC II or Automotive Servicing NC I.

Not to mention, the administrator also granted the request of the BGEN Nolasco A. Mempin, Commander of 1003rd, 10ID PA for a multiplier training of his uniformed personnel in PV System Installation NC II so that they will become trainers in the said qualification.

To bolster the vibrant culture of research and innovation in the Center, RTC-KorPhil Davao through its KorPhil Research and Development Unit holds a two-day symposium gathering the second year students of the Diploma of Technology programs slated on March 23-24, 2021.



Administrator Engr. Constantino B. Panes Jr EdD opened the event at the Multipurpose Hall of the Center highlighting the significant role of the student researchers in developing useful technology that can be brought in the community.

Speakers of the symposium were resident researchers Engr. Jeric F. Bilita, Engr. Ailyn B. Rodriguez, Engr. Lougino A. Miguel, Ms. Mary Grace C. Pelayo, MHSS, Engr. Rome Balbanida and Ms. Ianna Marie Pioquinto.

Topics discussed were about Research and Development and Technology in the Philippines; Introduction to Research; How to Write Chapters 1-5; Intellectual Property Rights (Patents); and the National TESD Research Agenda.

The Center Librarian Ms. Jessa Jessah E. Fuerzas also talked inputs and techniques of writing correct references in the American Psychological Association (APA) style.

The prime objective of the symposium is to capacitate the students in preparing an effective research proposals containing chapters 1 to 3 for checking prior to their proposal defense set starting first week of April, this year.

ORIENTATION: Assessor from Wangan National Agricultural School Ms. Erlinda V. Ferrer opened today, March 25, the second day of the Rice Machinery Operations NC II assessment orienting the 10 candidates on how they will successfully pass and finally get their National Certificates.

Candidates are scholars of the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act (UAQTEA) in Montevista, Davao de Oro trained earlier this year by Engr. Gabby C. Lanticse who will show in the assessment their knowledge, skills and attitude in operating at least 9 rice machineries.

First day of the assessment yesterday garnered a 100% passing rate of the candidate with assessment proceedings monitored by TESDA representative Mr. Joseph Junio.

Today, the new candidates are still to pass 3 out of 6 core competencies of the qualification with the observance of the designated TESDA representative Engr. Jeric F. Bilita.

As per guidelines, only 10 candidates per day are allowed to take the assessment, hence making the whole assessment to run for three days catering the said 25 candidates.
