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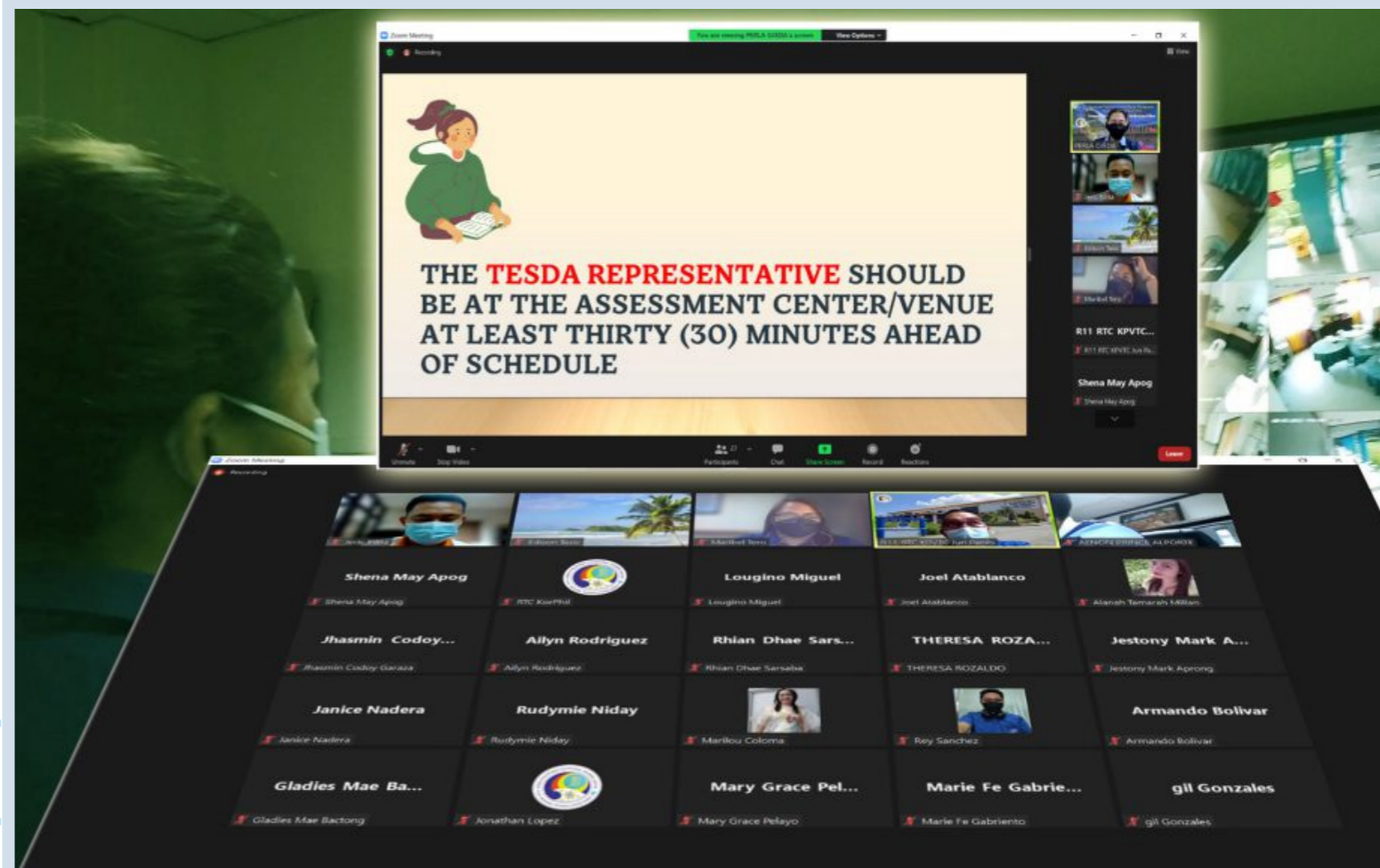
## RTC-KorPhil Davao Reorients Employees On Role Of TESDA Rep In National Assessment

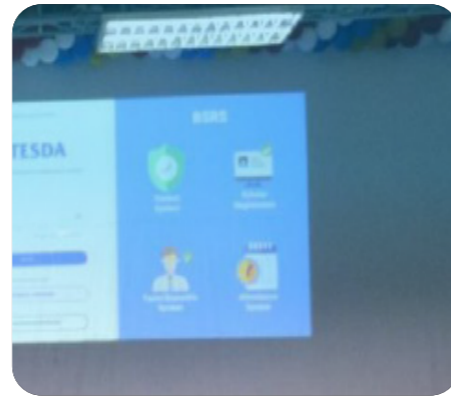
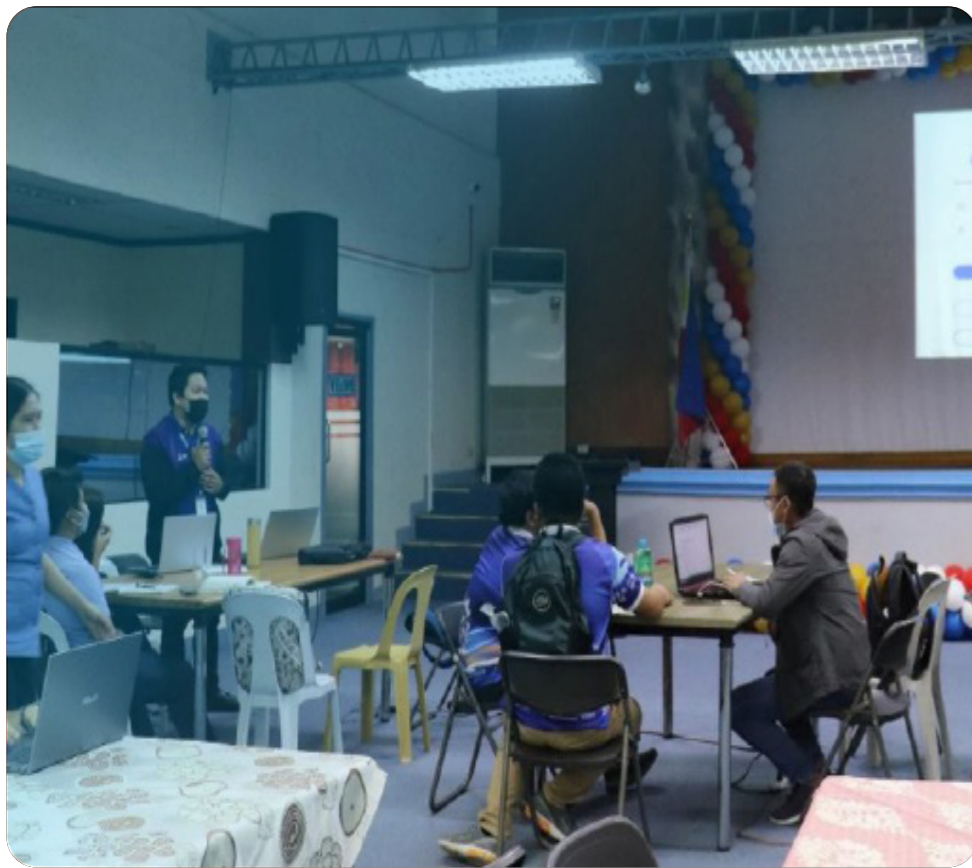

As per guidelines, only regular employees are allowed to become TRep who will check that the assessor has the Letter of Appointment, the assessment started on time and is done according to standard operating procedures, the documents are accomplished and submitted promptly, the complaints are handled properly, among other related functions of the assessor stipulated in the Report of Assessment Proceedings.

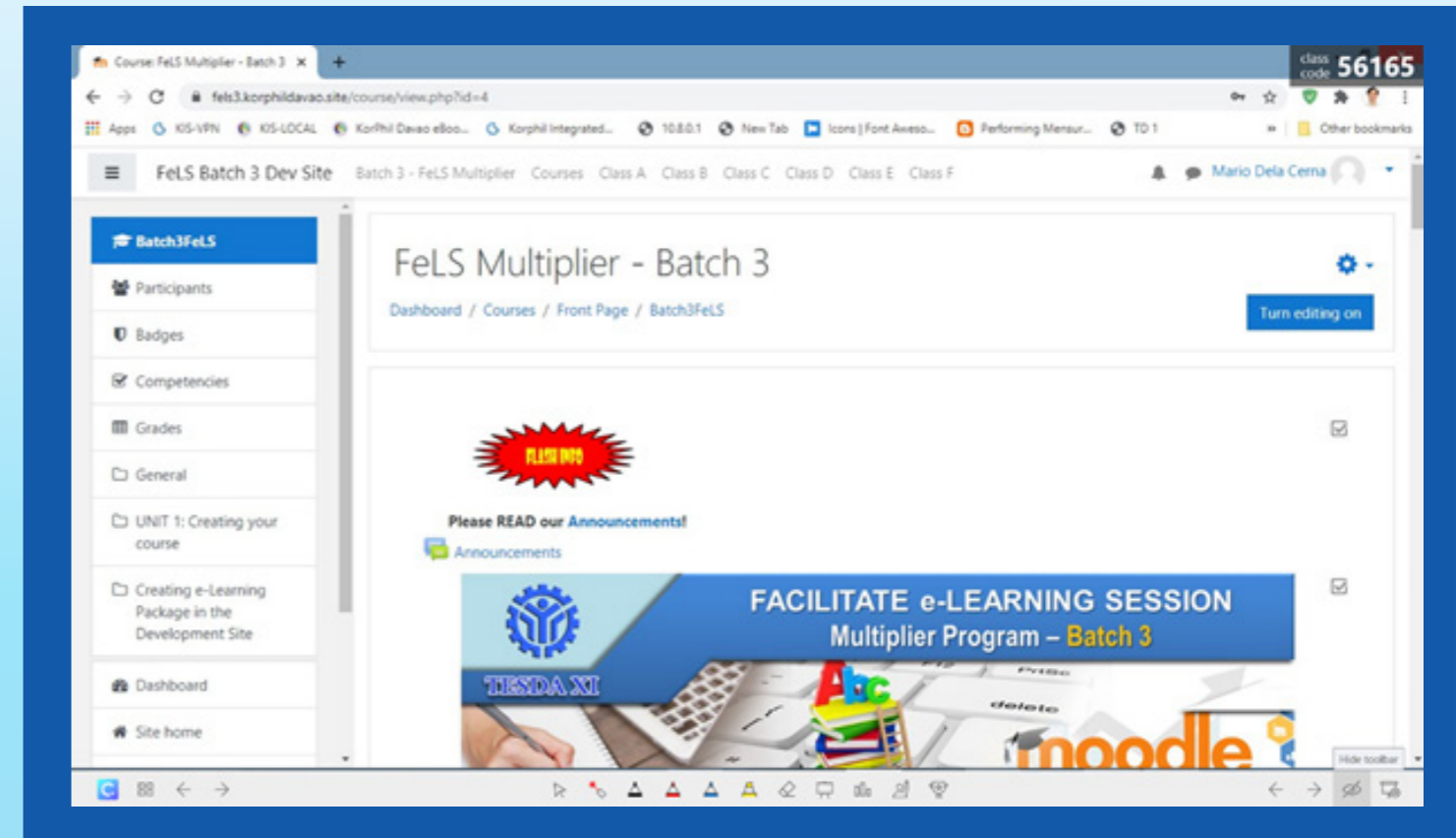
By the numbers, RTC-KorPhil Davao has 34 TReps who will be rotating alphabetically to function as watchdog during the assessment.

## RTC-KorPhil Davao To Adopt Biometric-Enabled Scholarship Registration System (BSRS)

TESDA RTC-KorPhil Davao starting March this year will be preparing all the necessary procedures and coordination with the Regional and Central Office to enroll scholars in a biometric attendance technology adopting the Biometric-Enabled Scholarship Registration System of TESDA. Hence, a learning session for all the trainers of the Center was conducted on March 23, 2022 at the mini theater .

The learning session facilitated by the ICT team and Registrar's office of RTC-KorPhil Davao has coursed the contents of TESDA Circular No. 16 series of 2022, which outlines the implementing guidelines on the use of BSRS.

In the BSRS, attendance of the scholars will be monitored through facial recognition that serves as a control mechanism to arrest fraudulence in scholarship claims and duplication of entries, which are limitations of the T2MIS, the current TESDA registration system that is supported by a manual attendance system.

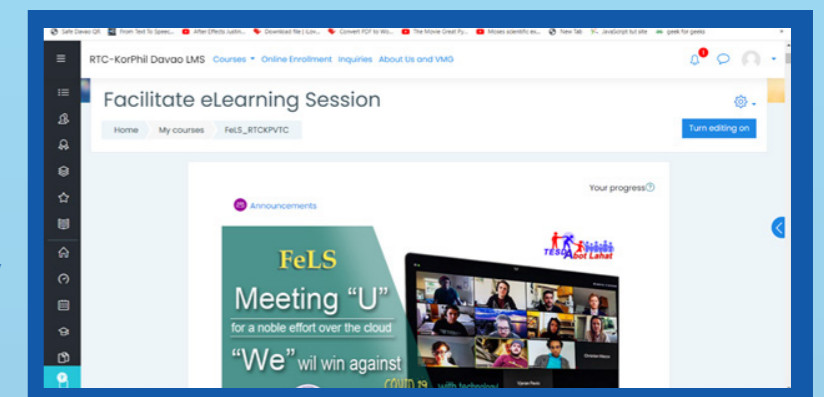
The progressive adoption of BSRS is hoped to translate into ubiquitous scholarship registration, easy attendance checking and enriched integrity of scholar's list.

Due to the dreadful attack of COVID-19, TESDA in 2020 launched the Facilitate e-Learning Session (FeLS) online training program throughout the country to mitigate the vacuum of face-to-face sessions by pushing TVET institutions to conduct Online Learning Trainings over its Learning Management System (LMS). Regional Lead Trainers were trained via online facilitated by the National TVET Training Academy (NTTA) with the help of e-TESDA office. To reecho in TESDA XI, Mr. Mario dela Cerna became the Team Leader of TESDA Davao Region together with Ms. Thelma Requilo of the Regional Operations Division (ROD) and selected FeLS graduates from NTTA & e-TESDA conducted series of batches of online trainings participated by both Public (TTIs) and Private TVET institutions (TVIs) in the region. When the FeLS' Competency Based Curriculum (CBC) was released by the Central Office, RTC-KorPhil Davao successful registered it and added to the courses of the Center with its independent Development site for FeLS online learners.

On January 11, 2022 via [www.lms.korphildavao.site](http://www.lms.korphildavao.site) for knowledge-based e-Learning packages with its development site at [www.fels3.korphildavao.site](http://www.fels3.korphildavao.site) , the new recruited trainers/teachers of the Center together with enrollees coming from Davao City Provincial Training Center (PTC) and Davao Occidental PTC (batch-3) did their best in surviving on this very tedious and technical online training where they created their respective actual e-Learning packages over the Center's Development site. The course was designed for one week (including Saturday and Sunday) but due to some internet difficulties especially in Davao Occidental, the training extended to three days.

### Significant Outcome/Result of the Event

This online training equipped new TVET trainers to conduct online training with appropriate knowledge and skills to become more resilient and help mitigate the chaos brought by COVID-19 in our educative system especially in TESDA.

## Test Run of Bio-Mass Generator (Prototype B)

On the early morning of January 29, 2022, Saturday, the Director General of TESDA, Secretary Isidro S. Lapeña, Ph.D., CSEE came to RTC-KorPhil Davao at the MEITE building to personally witness the Test Run of Bio-Mass Generator (Prototype B).

Engr. Reyman Zamora demonstrated to the TESDA Director General on how to run his created machine which uses syn-gas to drive the generator to produce electricity or drive circular saw that is very helpful in rehabilitating the places devastated by typhoon Odette. Engr. Zamora also shown to the Secretary the by-products of the project such as charcoal and wood vinegar.

According to Engr. Zamora, this project can be very useful in the next wave of reaching out program of TESDA, dubbed as “**TESDAmayan**” in line to the “**TESDA Abot Lahat**” advocacy.



### Significant Outcome/Result of the Event

This research project of Engr. Zamora will motivate trainers of RTC-KorPhil Davao to conceptualize research projects that could help the community especially to those people who are in need of help. It will also serve as model for 3-Year Diploma students in creating research project (thesis) as part of their curriculum.

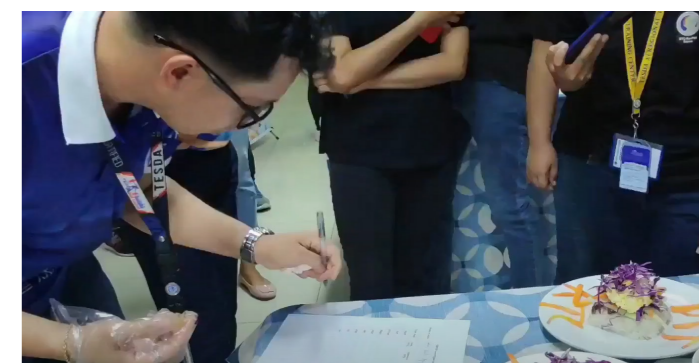

## TESDA RTC-KorPhil Davao Trains AFP Civil Relations Group In Basic Videography Production



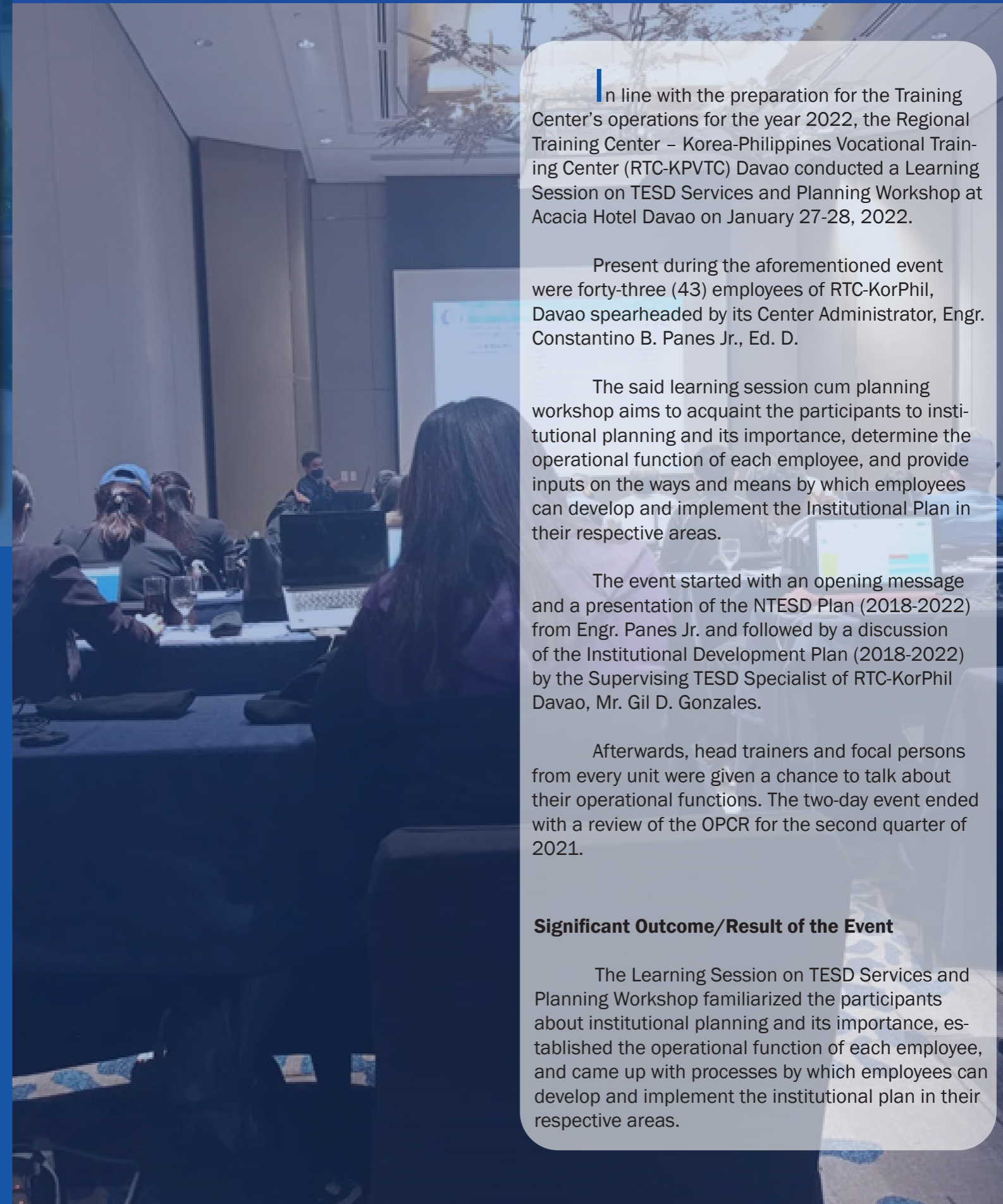
The TESDA RTC-KorPhil trained AFP personnel from the Philippine Army, Philippine Air Force and Philippine Navy for a 240-hour session in Basic Videography Production.

Handled by the DIT Head Trainer, Mr. Mario dela Cerna, the short-term course was attended by ten selected uniformed and few non-uniformed personnel across Mindanao organized by the AFP East Mindanao Command (EastMinCom) for them to acquire formal training on video production and video documentation to enhance their skills and capabilities in carrying-out their mission in Civil Relations over digital platform. As the higher command demanded earlier deployment of the selected AFP personnel to lead their respective Civil Relations Groups in the different regions in Mindanao, the number of sessions per week was doubled and a specially created e-Learning package for the course over RTC-KorPhil Davao's Online LMS was complemented.

On March 17, 2022 the group graduated, confirmed by the Head of the Training Department of RTC-KorPhil Davao Ms. Marilou F. Coloma together with the Supervising TESD Specialist Mr. Gil D. Gonzales who handed the Training Completion Certificates.

The RTC-KorPhil Davao have covered on February 11 and 14, 2022 its Social Marketing and Advocacy Committee (SMAC) team to talk on its new structure and to review its documentation procedure. On February 11 at the Center's Mini-Theater, newly-minted focal Mr. Mario dela Cerna accepted officially the key responsibility to man the SMAC team, short after the release of Office Order 11 series of 2022 signed by TESDA XI Regional Director Engr. Lorenzo G. Macapili, DTE. In the same day, former-SMAC-focal-now-assistant-focal Engr. Jeric F. Bilita gave lectures on newswriting with topics about definition, elements, qualities, types and structure of news. Additional topics include qualities of a news writer and pitfalls of newswriting. Engr. Bilita highlighted the crucial role of newswriting as one of the ways to document the operations of the Training Center.



In the newswriting session, ten members of the SMAC team acquired knowledge on how to establish a headline, lead, body and tail of a news article. On Valentine's Day, February 14, the SMAC team continued to learn other documentation activities such as photography using a Mobile Phone and a Digital Single-Flex Lens (DSLR) camera. Mr. dela Cerna presented techniques in capturing photos. He said pictures are essential supplements for a well-documented event as it does not only enhance the story but it also provided proof that events really happened since the readers can see it on their eyes. With the new learning gained, the SMAC team hoped to document all events in the Training Center leaving no stories untold. Currently, the team is composed of an overall Focal, Asst. ## RTC-KorPhil Davao Expands Training Presence In Digos, Matanao; To Train 100 Rice Farmers This May

Rice growers in the City of Digos and Municipality of Matanao in Davao del Sur are set to acquire recommended farming technologies and practices as RTC-KorPhil Davao allocated 100 scholarship slots for the TESDA's Farmers' Field School in rice.

This comes true as agriculture trainers and scholarship focal of the Center met on March 28, 2022 to initiate planning with the City and Municipal Agriculturists of Digos and Matanao respectively for the four batches of FFS in the Production of High Quality Inbred Rice, Seed Certification and Farm Mechanization.



Funded under the Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF), the 17-day training covers competencies from land preparation, crop establishment, water management, nutrient management, pest management, harvesting and post-harvesting.

Planned to roll out on May this year, the training will capacitate the farmers to attain productive yield and higher profit.

Around 50 members, mostly women, of the Dibabawon tribe in Brgy. Gupitan, Kapitalong Davao del Norte were trained in Installing Lightning Systems leading to Electrical Installation Maintenance (EIM) NC II, in an effort to finally bring light into the homes of the recipients through TESDA's training program according to the plan of TESDA XI.

The shared leadership of the Office of the Regional Director (ORD) XI Engr. Lourenzo G. Macapili, DTE and RTC-KorPhil Davao Center Administrator Engr. Constantino B. Panes Jr. Ed.D paved the way for the Training Induction Program of the participants on February 21, 2022 at Sitio Dugayan, Brgy. Gupitan.

With the training proper implemented in March, ORD and RTC-KorPhil Davao culled out around Php 300,000.00 to procure the needed electrical and wiring devices which will be installed by the beneficiaries in their own houses.

Trainer John Paul L. Dingal, LPT said that the training will not only give light to the homes but will also give possible employment opportunities to the trainees. Dingal shared that some of his previous trainees were now hired to assist electricians and are now earning good with the skills they learned from TESDA.

Tribal Leader of Sitio Dugayan Datu Danilo Osod represented the Dibabawon beneficiaries in expressing gratitude to TESDA for bringing the timely and much-needed government program to his tribe.

Brgy. Gupitan is an identified priority area this 2022 under the EO 70 or Whole-of-the-Nation-Approach in attaining peace and order in the community.

## RTC-KorPhil Davao Mechatronics Trainees To Represent Philippines In Asian Skills Tilt

### The Gold was paid with the right KASH!

It took the right Knowledge, Attitude, Skills and Habits (KASH) for the two trainees of RTC-KorPhil Davao to pocket the coveted gold Medal in the Philippine National Skills Competition held last 2021, which gave them the ticket to the World Skills Asia in Shanghai, China on October 2022.



Winning the top place in the PNSC last December 13-16, 2021, Juniel A. Algodon, 24, and Kier Erwin M. Susteverio, 23, is set to represent the Philippines in a tougher international skills competition waging battles against Asian countries in the Mechatronics Skills Area.

### NATIONAL PREPARATION

The road to national gold was never easy for the duo. Juniel and Kier Erwin poured determination, perseverance and discipline to acquire the necessary competencies to beat the competition standards and to garner a final rating of 97%. The two also shared the importance of communication during the competition considering that mechatronics, unlike other skills areas, have two competitors. **“Dapat may communication kami palage ng aking partner dahil useless lang ang pag enhance nang skills kung hindi kami nag kakaintindihan sa tuwing kami ay nag perform sa aming task na ginagawa”**, said by Kier Erwin M. Sustiverio to highlight communication as an important key to their teamwork.

Dubbed as the Best Training Center in the Philippines for the past three consecutive years, the RTC-KorPhil Davao has been benchmarked for its best practices by Development Academy of Bangsamoro (DAB) and Bangsamoro Planning and Development Authority (BPDA) on March 15, 2022.

# RTC-KorPhil, Davao Holds Its 2022 1st Commencement Exercises
