PROUD MANDAYA DEL SUR' BET IS SOLE CHALLENGER IN WALL, FLOOR TILLING

A member of the Mandaya tribe is now gunning his skills as sole competitor to defeat the competition standards in the Wall and Floor Tilling Area in this year's edition of Davao Regional Skills Competition held on November 16-18 at the sprawling Regional Training Center-KorPhil in Buhisan, Tibungco, Davao City.A first year trainee of the 3-year Diploma in Civil Engineering Technology, Wilson Lloyd W. de Jesus grasped that being the only competitor does not guarantee him a free ticket for the Philippine National Skills Competition and that he needed to unleash his full potential to beat the World Skills Standard.In an interview, de Jesus revealed that wall and floor tilling, contrary to what is portrayed easy in TV commercials, is a difficult job which is why many people hired professional tiler than do it themselves. Hence, the said skill area requires utmost patience, perseverance and dedication. "Pinaka lisud ang pag cutting sa tiles kay gamay lang na ligas, dili na pantay ang resulta (Cutting tiles is the most difficult because even tiny error leads to uneven results)," de Jesus said. Responsible for the progress of de Jesus is the expert Edison S. Tasic who have exhausted all possible ways to prepare his competitor for the RSC. Tasic shared their felt challenges experience in their preparations. "We have a hard time due to the restrictions implemented, but with our efforts and support from colleagues and institution, our ultimate goal is to bag a gold and get the chance for the national competition", Tasic said.

TESDA XI TIES WITH LOCAL RADIO STATIONS TO PROMOTE RSC

To reach the widest audience for the Regional Skills Competition 2021, TESDA XI tied partnerships with local radio stations in Davao City for promotion and updates as live audience is limited due to the current pandemic.

LOOK: TESDA XI and DA-ATI XI in collaboration with the office of Senator Cynthia A. Villar piloted a rice farming technology demonstration through a Farmers' Field Day (FFD) at Villar SIPAG Farm School in Buhangin, Davao City on October 25, 2021.

The FFD was graced by 15 trainers and instructors of TESDA XI headed by Regional Director Engr. Lorenzo G. Macapili, DTE with DA-ATI XI Center Director Dante G. Esguerra and Liason Officer of the Office of Senator Villar Mr. Joel M. Mamac. The activity showcased the performance of NSIC Rc 480, also known as Green Supper Rice (GSR8), planted in a demonstration area supported by Solar Powered Irrigation System (SPIS).

Bred and tested at International Rice Research Institute, GSR8 is observed to be tolerant to different abiotic stresses, and have been proven to perform well even with less inputs such as fertilizers and pesticides.

DEL SUR. ORIENTAL SQUARE UP TO TAKE HOME GOLD IN COOKING

Following the ongoing competition of the 2021 Davao Regional Skills Competition, two competitors under Cooking exhibited their skills on November 23–25, 2021 at RTC-Korea Philippines Vocational Training Center in Buhisan, Tibungco, Davao City.

Davao Oriental entrant, Merlyn P. Ampong, is a trainee of Commercial Cooking NC IV from Davao Oriental Institute of Technology (DOIT) under the supervision of her expert Mr. Arvin S. Balisanzo. Merlyn is also a holder of Cookery NC II and Commercial Cooking NC III.

Merlyn shared that although she has experienced competing during her high school days, the environment, as well as the pressure she felt now, was different, but said she will still do her best in the competition. On the other hand, Davao City/Sur contender, Bob Christian M.
