TESDA Director General Danilo P. Cruz And Party Visit RTC-KorPhil

he new TESDA Director General Danilo P. Cruz visited the Center on November 24, 2022 at around 1:00 PM during his Davao Region site visit. The 13th TESDA Director General who is an attorney in profession, was accompanied by Deputy Director General for TESD Operations, Aniceto D. Bertiz, III and the DG's Executive Assistant.

Before the key officials of TESDA Davao Region and RTC-KorPhil personnel, DG Cruz in his speech, emphasized guidelines on how to run TESDA in his term which is in line with the dream of the President – a better life for the Filipino people; He said that TESDAns should bear in mind that provision of Technical and Vocational education is not all about enhancing the skills of our people, but it is about improving the economic and social standing of the Filipino workforce...our training programs should not only serve as bridges of the Filipino workforce for jobs openings but more importantly our programs will serve as wheels that enable our constituents to navigate the multiple and varying needs of the economy. Our programs should not end up only to the everchanging and evolving demands of the industries, but should produce workers with multiples skills and competencies who can easily shift from one occupation to another, from one industry to another, and from one work environment to another. Because according to DG Cruz who was a former DOLE undersecretary, this is the only way that we can truly lift up our Filipino workers from the pit of poverty.

After the plenary, DG Cruz and DDG Bertiz inspected the ongoing construction of the Innovation Center for the RTC-KorPhil Davao.

The report of the Head of the Administrative Department, Aenon Prince Alporte, CPA completed the rundown of presentations for the Center's performance this year. Although the report may not be the final one as the processes of Finance and Administrative matters are still going-on, to-date report was rendered by Mr. Alporte. He said that the appropriations and collections against the training cost and other needs of the Center is just in the sense of balance that runs around 90 Million pesos.

It is also timely that the arrival of the new Korean Overseas Volunteer, Mr. Choi Gyongsik from his orientation-training in KOICA Philippine Office in Manila coincided the YEPA activity. Despite he arrived late, he attended even rendered a Korean song during the event.

To spice-up the occasion, a live band energized the affair so much so that one of the trainers, Mikko Rosell sang with the band making other participants to dance with their reggae music.

As part of the program, four groups consist of the different trade areas and offices of the Center competed on a TikTok Dance contest. This challenge exempted no one; young and old, officials or rank and file really danced with their assigned groups. Hence, dynamic but hilarious presentations added colors to the occasion.

After the awarding of the winners, the program was inspired and closed by the Center Administrator, Engr. The RTC-KorPhil Davao YEPA 2022

W ith full of joy, the RTC-KorPhil Davao people gathered at the Holiday Ocean View Resort, Island Garden City of Samal, Davao del Norte last December 21-22, 2022 to conduct the Center's Year-End Performance Assessment (YEPA) considering that the overall performance output of RTC-KorPhil Davao reached about 99% (with ongoing activities until the end of December 2022 to add the output rate).

The Center's YEPA this year was officially opened by Mr. Gil Gonzales, Supervising TESDS with an impulse message to KorPhilians to sustain the commendable performance and thresh-out those undesirable practices that dragged down some laudable efforts of others and missed out some opportunities of the Center to shine. He wished that until his retirement next year, he is hoping that the performance of the Center will not falter.

Mr. Jestony Mark Aprong, the Scholarship Focal then followed and presented his monitored matrix of allotted scholarships (all modes) for the Center from their dates of release to the implementation with the Training Department. He explained that the lowest part in the UAQTEA scholarship implementation was on the batch of Diploma program where the COVID 19 pandemic was at its peak nevertheless recovered when the havoc of the pandemic weakened. Along with his presentation, Mr. Aprong made an analysis and pointed-out what to enforce and hinted some strategies to anticipate downsides in the next round of scholarship allocations next year.

The report of Head of the Training Department then followed. Mrs. Marilou Coloma presented the outputs of each department (in 9 trade areas) in all modes. She emphasized the great help of the "Catch-Up Plan" in attaining the goals of the training department this year especially to the priority trade areas to which the Central Office flowed high number of scholarship grants. Mrs. Coloma also thanked the trainers behind the Center scholarship (Free training fee but NO allowance) implementations especially those which were conducted in the communities.

Report of the Competency Assessment and Certification Focal, Mrs. Perla Ojeda came next. Partially the report of the existing records from their office was presented as the competency assessments of RTC-KorPhil's students still going on including of those walk-in candidates.

KOICA Sends A KOV Anew

he vacuum of five (5) years where no Korean Overseas Volunteer (KOV) was dispatched in RTC-KorPhil Davao due to the implementation of Martial law in 2016, series of strong earthquakes in Davao Region and the surge of COVID 19 pandemic is now over. KOICA sends KOV Choi Gyongsik to the Center and arrived in Davao City on November 22, 2022 where he was fetched from the airport and welcomed by the KorPhilians with a cordial party at RTC-KorPhil mini-theater.

In the welcome party, the new KOV felt home as he rubbed shoulders with the pioneering personnel of the Center who had been trained in Korea for two times and worked with the Korean experts in establishing the RTC-KorPhil Davao until its inauguration in March 8, 2005.

From 2005 to 2016 KOICA regularly sent batches of KOVs every two (2) years to which RTC-KorPhil trainees, trainers and the KOVs really enjoyed and very comfortable in their cooperative and collaborative leanings and concerted efforts. Hence, when the dispatch of KOVs halted due to abovesaid reasons, it caused a vacuum to KorPhilians.

Mr. Choi previously worked at the Department of Performing Arts and Entertainment as visiting Professor at Jeonju University and will be teaching Korean Language and Culture in RTC-KorPhil and likewise will lead the conduct of the annual Korean Cultural Festival during the founding anniversary of the Center come March 8, 2023 to which his talent and expertise will be applied aptly.

The new KOV after stayed in Davao for one (1) week, came back to Manila to complete his orientation in volunteering works facilitated by KOICA Philippine Office in coordination with the Philippine National Volunteer Service Coordinating Agency (PNVSCA). He will be coming back to the Center on December 21, 2022 to start his mission as KOV in RTC-KorPhil Davao.



2022 Diploma Programs Graduation

Despite the havoc and negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic to the Diploma programs of the RTC-KorPhil Davao, one hundred thirteen (113) joyful graduates of the 3-Year Diploma programs of the Center with their proud parents marched during the 2022 2nd Commencement Exercises on December 16, 2022, 1:00 PM at the RTC-KorPhil Davao's Multi-purpose Hall.

To recall, the first batch of RTC-KorPhil Davao's Diploma program was only two (2) years before the 3-Year Diploma program for the nine (9) trade areas of the Center was offered in 2018. On this 16th day of December, 2022, the graduates were all belong to the 3-Year Diploma programs of the Center.

These students from the first batch of 3-Year diploma programs undergone not only the challenges of their curriculum but by the skintight squeeze brought by the challenges of COVID-19 pandemic along with their three years of learning journey. The theme of the graduation "Pagbangon, Pag-asa at Pag-abante Tungo sa Makabagong Trabaho" befitted the ordeals experienced by the graduates and their parents/guardians hence they felt it deep inside and proud on how they beat such. Vis-à-vis to the theme Barangay Captain Merjade Deles-Calvo encouraged the graduates in her message that they should not stop from making themselves better all the time and in every circumstance they are to face as they are now leaving the portals of their Alma Mater and to start facing the next chapters of their lives in the world of works.
